KEEP THAT GRASS YOUNG AND GROWING! PART 2

Management Intensive Rotational Grazing (MIRG) is a flexible rotational grazing system that adjusts paddock size, stocking density, and grazing period to balance the supply of forage with the nutrient needs of animals throughout the grazing season. MIRG allows animals to graze only a small portion of a pasture while other paddocks rest and recover with sufficient moisture.

Across the country and season to season the amount and type of forage can vary greatly. Often grass quality is dependent on the weather, especially if you don't irrigate. Here in NW Oregon it can vary greatly. Last April I planted grass and clover on about 3 acres. Then we had little to no rain until September. Nothing grew except weeds until we had consistent rain in September. This year we've had mostly cooler days and it's raining at least once a week: pastures look great! Ewes are milking well and lambs are growing.


Looking at Photo 1 you can see lush grass and clover, both of which are starting to go to seed. You would

think that the sheep would be all over this luscious feed but Photo 2 shows you what they actually do. If you look



in the center of the photo you can see where it's been eaten down short, leaving the pasture looking uneven.



That short grass and clover has a lot of sugar in it and sheep love sugar. If allowed, they'll continue to eat only the short, sweet new growth. The older forage will progress further into maturity, going to seed, drying out and becoming both less palatable and less nutritious.

To break this pattern we need to force the sheep to eat all the forage before it goes into seed production. Or if we don't have enough sheep for our acreage, we can put the whole pasture into a growing, nutritious stage by mowing/clipping the field if there's enough moisture for it to regrow.

Katahdins with their hair coats are easy to train to electric fencing and there's good options available at local feed stores. Premier1 has an extensive fencing section for planning and purchase. Rotational grazing using portable fencing works very well. A very important part of using electric fencing, especially in early training, is having a hot, well grounded charger. Tens of thousands of wool sheep graze the grass seed fields here in the

Willamette Valley over winter using 2 strands of solid wire. I'm sure all the rain helps with shock value. Initially you may need to put your sheep in an area with several extra strands so they will learn more quickly to respect the wires. I like to have at least 6 joules at the fence. Lambs learn quickly and you can raise and lower the wires as needed.

Some people like the electric netting which is fairly easy to set up and move. It MUST be kept hot or it can become a death trap. People often mow or step down grass to keep it from shorting out. What works very well for me is poly-wire on the small fiberglass posts with little metal clips. I use 3 strands and like to have one strand be poly-tape which makes the fence much more visible. On exterior fences I use 4 strands. I've not had coyotes come through 4 strands. Cougars? Well they can jump over any fence. I do run LGDs.

You can buy reels to wind the poly-wire onto for winter storage and to move the fence. If you don't have

enough sheep to graze a section down in 3-5 days clipping/mowing the pastures starting in May or whenever your grass starts going to seed will keep the grass at a short, highly nutritious state that is very palatable to young and old sheep alike. This makes a huge difference in nutrition for them and will allow you to stock more sheep on a smaller acreage, getting lambs to sale weights in the spring, when prices are highest. This can then get us back down to the numbers of sheep that our pastures can support by the time grass growth slows down. Irrigating can greatly extend the good grazing season; it can be as simple as a few hoses and sprinklers.

That MI part of MIRG? Management Intensive. Yes, unless you have permanent paddocks, moving the fence every 5 days is a lot of work, but the value you get? You greatly increase the production of your fields at the same time providing nutritious feed for your flock. Watching your flock graze, lambs grow and ewes put weight back on is a real joy. KRK

Tips for Ram Success

Most shepherds undervalue rams when they need a new sire for the flock. We know that the ram is 50% of the first lamb crop, and his contribution goes up from there, as we save daughters over several years. Therefore, the ram you choose to lead you into the future can certainly “make or break” your program. In this article, I will attempt to give you some tips for success with your next superstar.

First, your program should be market driven, meaning that you should

know who you are likely to sell to, and what they are looking for in their purchases. Use these traits to guide ram selection, and meet the needs of your customers. People buying 4-H lambs for their children to show may desire something different from customers who sell everything on the ethnic slaughter market. Heavy feeders may need a different sheep than grass based programs, and so on. Just know your market, and you will be more successful when selecting your stud ram.

In recent years, many tools have been developed to help guide you in selection. Of course, visual appraisal is still important, but should be combined with performance data when available, and genetic tools now in use. Many traits, such as growth, muscling, parasite resistance, and hair coat, can be genetically predicted, or tracked through EBVs and other available data. At a minimum, the owner should be able to provide weights and growth rates of ram lambs, and how he performed against his peers. A ram that may sire 50 to 100 lambs

in a season is worth taking the time to study, and worth paying more for than most are willing to invest.

When you get him home, place him in a safe pen or lot, away from other rams. Many rams are killed each year by fighting, and the rule is that cheap, ugly rams kill beautiful, expensive rams EVERY time. I have also seen several killed through the fence, without ever getting together, so keep them totally isolated. Make sure he has plenty of shade in the summer, as direct sunlight on testicles can “heat shock” sperm and render him sterile for a period. Sperm production takes around eight weeks, so a ram that suffers infertility from heat in August may not be fertile until late in the fall, if at all.

Nutrition of the ram before and during the breeding season should also be a priority. Chasing ewes and breeding a large group requires tremendous energy, and he will need to be supplemented, whether you are grass based or provide grain. Many

Ovine Progressive Pneumonia: What Katahdin Producers Need to Know

The following is the first in a series of articles that the authors hope will increase understanding of Ovine Progressive Pneumonia, explain the recent advances in genetic testing, and chart a path toward better control of this disease in the Katahdin breed.

Ovine Progressive Pneumonia (OPP) is a slowly developing viral disease of sheep. It's part of a family of viruses known as Small Ruminant Lentiviruses. It's not unique to the U.S. and is referred to as Visna Maedi elsewhere in the world.

Unlike many other diseases, OPP affects multiple organs and systems of the body including the mammary and respiratory systems often resulting in "hard bag", difficulty breathing and in maintaining body condition. It also causes inflammation of the joints leading to arthritis and reduced mobility. Because the disease usually develops slowly, it's frequently not detected until sheep are a few years old. Often, just when a ewe should be reaching her prime production years, she struggles to raise her lambs, has difficulty

maintaining body condition, or fails to recover adequately from lactation. Without awareness and testing, these symptoms can be easily dismissed as subclinical mastitis, premature tooth wear or damage, or the animal simply labeled as a "hard keeper" and culled. Although that individual has been removed from the flock, it's likely more infected individuals remain.

while lambing, are especially vulnerable to spread of the disease. Once infected, sheep remain so for life, and there is no effective treatment or vaccine.

In the U.S., OPP can cause extensive financial losses to sheep producers due to decreased ewe productivity (about 20%) leading to premature culling or death. Although not all studies have shown a negative economic impact of OPP, researchers at the U.S. Meat Animal Research Center in Nebraska reported fewer lambs born and poorer growth of lambs born to infected mothers. Surveys of U.S. sheep flocks have shown that over one third of sheep operations have infected animals and nearly a quarter of all animals tested were positive. Katahdins are not immune to the disease, and unfortunately, many flocks have tested positive and some Katahdin breeders have struggled to eradicate it.

Blood testing is the most practical way to determine if OPP is present in your flock. Blood tests for OPP are available through many commercial labs in the U.S. A laboratory test known as ELISA is the standard and looks for antibodies to the virus present in blood serum. Despite testing, detecting OPP can be difficult. It may take weeks to months for sufficient antibodies to the infection to build up to detectable levels, often referred to as seroconversion. Consequently, follow-up testing, six to nine months after an initial

OPP FACTS

- Viral disease that causes wasting, lung damage, arthritis and reduced milk production
- Progresses slowly and infection may be present but no symptoms observed
- First clinical signs are often loss of body condition and "hard bag"
- Can be costly - reducing number born and gain of lambs
- Blood tests available, but no effective treatment or vaccines - sheep remain infected for life
- Eradication may be complicated, expensive and take months to years to accomplish
- Genetic testing for susceptibility holds promise for controlling spread of the disease

The OPP virus is spread from sheep to sheep through two main pathways. First, infected ewes can pass the virus to their lambs in colostrum and milk. Second, infected sheep transfer the virus to uninfected sheep by breathing/sneezing/coughing in close proximity to others. Sheep that are raised in confinement or are housed indoors seasonally such as during winter or

shepherds put rams up during the day and feed them, and turn them out at night. Regardless, high quality pasture or some supplement will be necessary to prevent weight loss and an energy deficit.

Breeding soundness exams are also a very valuable tool to insure fertility. They are usually reasonably priced, under \$100, and examine testicular size, firmness, and quality of ejacu-

late. I have seen entire lamb crops lost through the use of a ram with no viable sperm. Marking harnesses also help evaluate breeding success of rams. Changing colors of crayons after 16 days, (one cycle), will indicate the number of ewes returning to heat for a second or third time.

Trim feet of rams before the breeding season, and examine legs and joints for signs of arthritis and other

abnormalities. In addition, I suggest that you visually watch your ram breed a few ewes, to insure that he has adequate libido and ability to settle ewes.

Rams are possibly the most important piece of a sheep flock, and deserve to be treated as such. Taking the time to do the little things will lead you to a successful lamb crop during the next season. Good luck!

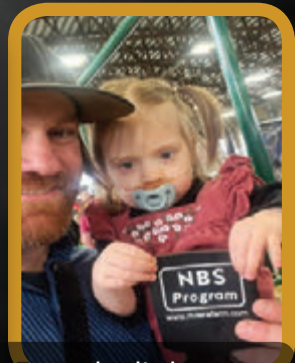

negative test, is a common practice. Also, infected sheep may not exhibit symptoms (e.g., loss of body condition, hard bag) for the first two years after infection. So, effective screening often focuses on older members of the flock. Finally, blood samples from lambs less than nine months old may trigger a positive test because of antibodies acquired passively when nursing their OPP-positive dam. However, these same lambs tested months later (e.g., at 12 - 18 months) may test negative.

For many years, shepherds were encouraged to control the disease by removing lambs from their infected dams at birth and artificially rearing them to prevent infection via colostrum and milk. Current research indicates direct transmission among adult sheep is more common than maternal transmission from infected dams to their progeny. More recently, strategies for eradicating OPP are based much more on testing, isolation, and culling.

Positive test results can be unset-

ling and evoke a variety of responses. For some producers, the only choice will be immediate removal of all positive sheep. Yet others may choose to manage the disease over time. An approach that holds promise is to create two separate flocks at your location, one comprised of sheep that have tested negative and another with positive sheep. Both flocks must remain separate including no fence-line contact. The goal is to eliminate the positive flock while expanding the negative flock by retaining uninfected ewe lambs over time. We recognize that transferring negative daughters from the positive ewe flock to the negative ewe flock requires time-appropriate follow-up testing and a tolerance for risk management. Still, it does allow for greater opportunity to maintain the genetic diversity of the flock. The added costs of labor and additional infrastructure, together with the importance of maintaining genetic diversity must be carefully considered. Although such an approach can be effective, it offers little to prevent

reinfection if a positive animal, such as an asymptomatic ram, is added to the flock. So, despite even the most thoughtful eradication process, OPP-free flocks may remain genetically predisposed to the virus.

With such a slowly developing virus, infected animals may remain undetectable for several months, opening the door for spread of the disease even with basic biosecurity protocols in place. For example, you buy a ram at a sale and quarantine him upon returning home. The next day you draw blood and send it off for testing. Even with a negative test result, follow-up tests six to nine months later may be required to know he's truly OPP free; even after that, there may still be a slight risk he is infected.

Frankly, its impractical for most Katahdin breeders to keep an animal in quarantine for nearly a year before exposing them to the main flock. A quality ram is a genetic investment and should be used as soon as practi-

Planning Matings Using the sheeptools.com Tool

Michelle Canfield, Canfield Farms, Snohomish WA

I wanted to share how I use the breeding planning tool on www.sheeptools.com. This site has a neat set of analysis tools for NSIP animals, created by software engineer and Katahdin producer Etienne Richards of Gibraltar Farm. The breeding planning tool I find to be profoundly useful.

It's simple to use. Open up the pop-up dialog box for both ewes and rams, and you can copy/paste a list of potential breeders to add to your list, using their NSIP IDs. Once a set of candidates is in, the tool automatically calculates the "pedigree EBVs" for a potential lamb born of each ewe/ram pairing. (Pedigree EBVs are just an average of the two parent's EBVs, a predictor of their lamb's potential before it's born.) So,

for starters, right in this web page you can analyze for each ewe which ram would be the best pairing for her. Either to maximize her strong traits or try to compensate for areas where she's weak. You can turn on color

ewes with four potential ram pairings.

Next you can export this data set out into Excel, where you can do more sorting and filtering. One thing I do right away is filter on pairings that have a high inbreeding coefficient (the "F" column in the sheet). That way I can mark those as no-go's in my planning spreadsheet. From there I usually review ewes by source ewe family, which I can sort on in my main data set. I try to make sure each source ewe family has diverse pairings with all my rams. I also ensure that each ram is getting a diverse set of ages of partners and a good range of my best and lowest scoring ewes. This makes a fair comparison between rams when resulting EBVs are calculated on their progeny.

I will make a first pass to put particular focus on choosing mates for my

cal. There needs to be a better way. Fortunately, geneticists have identified a gene that appears important in reducing susceptibility to OPP. We hope that genetic testing together with thoughtful biosecurity measures will lead to reduced incidence (and spread) of this disease among Katahdin flocks nationwide. We'll dedicate our next segment to the genetic underpinnings of this idea.

best ewes, as I'll be wanting to keep replacement daughters or sell breeding rams out of them. Once I've got the upper quartile planned, I just backfill with pairings for the remaining ewes, moving more quickly through the rest of the data set. I sell a lot of butcher lambs, so the lower end pairings don't really matter much, since they are likely to be terminal. I keep load balancing the counts for each ram until all the rams have about an equal number of ewes (ram lambs may get a smaller set).

I like to maintain my pairings in a separate tab in Excel. I have all my ewes in the rows, and the columns are sire choices and past sire use. I mark "X" for

all the pairings that are incompatible due to inbreeding. I make a note of "LB" for pairings that have some line breeding. Then I type the year in the cell for the pairing for that year. I like

to see what ram I've paired with a ewe in the past, as I'll typically make a different choice each year, to maximize diversity. Using the Excel filter tool (the drop-down arrows in the header row) I can filter for e.g., "2023" to see

how many ewes are assigned to a ram in that year. A snippet of this sheet is below.

Once I'm settled on my final pairing plans, I move this data into an

other spreadsheet that has a column for each ram, and then his ewes listed below him sorted in order. I print this out and put it on a clipboard. As I run sheep through the chute, I can right- or left-sort to sift out the mob that goes with each ram, harness him up, and set them in separate paddocks to go to work. With the help of my border collies, I can sort about 150 ewes into 3-4 breeding groups in a matter of a few hours. I use a similar spreadsheet on a clipboard to write down the date each ewe was marked, and this also helps me double check that she's with the intended ram and fix my records if she's not. Then I translate that back into my computer each evening so Ranch Manager knows each ewe's due date and the sire of her lambs.

I hope this is helpful as you think of how to plan your next breeding season. Thanks to Etienne for the useful tools he provides to the industry for free! They are invaluable!



Entry Fee: \$30 per head. All entry fees are due at time of entry and are nonrefundable. Entries are not complete until entry fees are paid. Fees

can be paid to KHSI using a PayPal account or credit card or a check can be mailed to Operations.

Entry forms: Entries may be made online through <https://katahdins.org> Look for the **Expo 2024** tab and select **Entries**. For those unable to do online entry, send completed entry form to Operations along with a check for entry fees. Note on entry form how consignor's check should be issued if different from consignor name.

Entry data: Additional data can be entered in the comments section. There is a separate line for animal's NSIP searchable database link. NSIP information sheet will be provided for buyers prior to auction. Highly recommend consignors also post entry information at pens.

Substitutions: Substitutions are allowed until **August 1** when registration and health papers are submitted, but consignors must maintain the correct ram/ewe ratio.

On-line Posting of Pictures: Entry pictures must be posted no later than **July 6**. Substitutions made after

July 6 are not guaranteed to have updated pictures. Post pictures to Sales@squareoneagrimarketing.com

Commission: 10% of the gross price is deducted from sale price and goes to KHSI.

Live Internet Bidding: LiveAuctions.TV will provide webcast services that allow the internet buyer to participate during the bidding process in live time.

Sale Order: Rams followed by Ewes - Top 10 selling first.

At check-in, each consignor will be given a scorecard to select their choice for the top 10 rams and top 10 ewes. The Sale Committee will use the rankings to establish the starting sale order for rams and ewes. After the top 10 ranked rams sell, the remaining rams sell based on birth date from oldest to youngest. The same procedure will be repeated with the ewes. **General sale order is registered rams, registered ewes, pens of registered ewes, single percentage 87.5% recorded ewes, and**

SALE REQUIREMENTS

Health Papers

1. Due at Check-in
2. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection must be less than 30 days old - **dated after July 8, 2024.**
3. 2 copies required for each animal in consignment. Multiple animals may be listed on the same paper, but must provide **2 copies for each animal.**
4. **Health papers must contain following information:**
 - a. Owner or consignor name and address
 - b. State that the sheep are consigned to the 2024 Katahdin Expo, Mexico, MO
 - c. Species & purpose of movement (ovine, interstate transfer and sale)
 - d. Private flock tag number for each animal
 - e. Federal Scrapie number: Premise ID and individual tag number for each animal
 - f. Age, sex, and breed of each animal.
 - g. Signature and printed name, address, and phone number of accredited veterinarian.

5. **All rams over 6 months of age (born before Feb. 7, 2024) must have a negative Brucella Ovis test. Test must be completed within the 30 days (after July 8) prior to the sale. Test results must be listed on health paper or be confirmed by documentation from the testing facility.**

6. **KHSI does not require or guarantee any other health assessments beyond those listed above. Any information exchanged beyond listed requirements is between buyer and seller.**

Registration papers - All animals must have a valid, signed registration paper turned in at sale check-in. Registration papers will be transferred and forwarded to buyers. Cost of transfers will be deducted from consignor settlements.

DNA Testing - All entries must be RR or QR at codon 171. **This is KHSI policy.** Codon status must be determined by lab analysis and copy of results provided at check-in. Referencing pedigree will not be accepted.

QQ will not sell. Codon status will be listed on sale order.

NSIP Data - To qualify for "N" paint brand denoting NSIP enrollment, animal must be in online NSIP data base. Animal's NSIP number must be included with entry information.

Inspection

1. Animals will not be penned that exhibit health problems, show signs of abuse, have no scrapie tag, are inconsistent with entry application, or show signs of coat shearing or clipping. Females within a month of lambing will not sell. Registered sheep cannot have docked tails or C coats. Sale management discourages docking tails of Kat+ ewes.
2. Yearling rams must have a minimum scrotal circumference of 32 cm. Ram lambs, including those under 6 months of age, must have a minimum scrotal circumference of 28 cm. Rams measuring below minimum will not sell.
3. Sheep will be checked for soundness in mouths and obvious breeding unsoundness. Animals determined to be unsound will not sell. Check for problems **before** bringing the sheep to the sale!
4. Evidence of horns being removed will be noted on sale order as "horned".
5. Recorded 87.5% 2024-born ewe lambs may be entered if they are expected to be registrable upon yearling coat inspection.

Care and Handling

1. All animals on the property will be handled humanely and with respect. If the KHSI Expo Sale committee/Board of Directors determines that consignors have abused or inhumanely handled their sheep, they reserve the right to remove animals from the sale and the consignor may be banned from the next KHSI Expo Sale.
2. Consignors must provide daily care for animals. This includes feed, water, etc. until the animal is sold and transferred to care of buyer/transporter.
3. Preparation for exhibit and sale should include washing sheep at home and/or sale facility and hoof

trimming. No alterations, clipping or shearing are allowed.

4. It is highly recommended that animals are trained to lead on halter as this facilitates moving from the pens to wash rack, sale ring and back.
5. Recommend that consignors be available to talk about animals at their pens as much as possible.
6. Bedding for sale animals will be provided. Must provide own bedding for transfer pens.

SALE PROCEDURES

Consignors Meeting - Held on Thursday and time will be announced or posted. Sale procedures will be explained and questions answered.

Contact Information - All consignors and bidders must provide a cell phone number with entry form or when registering for buyer number. Mail bids must have cell phone number of contact person and list who will haul purchased animals.

Payment for Purchases: Buyers must pay for their purchases immediately following the sale. Any other

arrangement must be approved prior to start of sale. LiveAuction.TV will oversee all aspects of payment. Buyers that **do not pay** for purchases will lose all KHSI membership rights until payment has been received and cleared.

After Sale - Buyers are expected to contact the seller within an hour of sale's end to take possession of the purchase or provide plans for transportation.

ity of the buyer to return a non-breeder to the seller in acceptable breeding condition. The seller, after a fair trial and if the animal is found to be a non-breeder, shall have the privilege of replacing the male or female with one of equal value to the satisfaction of the buyer and seller or refunding the purchase price. This guarantee shall not apply to any animals that are shown after the date of the sale.

2. Notification of non-breeder males must be made to the seller prior to March 1 following the sale. Notification of non-breeder females must be made to the seller prior to April 1 following the sale.
3. Animals that drop their lamb teeth prior to 12 months of age, as determined by the registration papers, shall be replaced with an animal of equal quality to the mutual satisfaction of the buyer and seller within a reasonable amount of time, or the consignor shall refund the purchase price of the animal promptly with all fees and percentages levied against such animal retained by the

sale. It shall be the responsibility of the buyer to notify the consignor, and they the sale manager, if such a problem occurs. Any consignor failing to comply with this rule shall automatically be barred from consigning any animals to the following sale.

Hi, I'm Karen Kenagy. My husband Seb and I live in the Willamette Valley of Oregon raising Katahdins in a region where grass-fed lamb is king! I've been privileged to serve on the KHSI BOD the last three years and I'm hoping to serve the association again. I'm interested in continuing to help our members. Katahdins fit into so many management systems, climates and purposes - such a versatile breed!

I've been raising Katahdins for 25+ years after raising wool sheep for 30 years. I see the value of representing our breed by showing at county and state fairs which is where I first saw Katahdins. At the Oregon and Washington fairs we work hard to bridge the huge gap between the producer and the consumer. Katahdins are no longer a rare sight and have been making an impression here on the West Coast as serious meat sheep.

I've been working on reorganizing our West Coast regional group, Pacific Coast Katahdin Hair Sheep

Association and have found people interested in doing so. We've hosted an annual Lamb Day, usually at our place. Through this, we've been able to educate Katahdin producers and KHSI members in our area through hair coat inspection training, grazing demonstrations, speakers and lamb care presentations. I also teach rotational grazing with easy portable fencing. It's been a rewarding way to help new farmers learn how to manage their sheep and their pastures.

Although we did host the Expo in 2009, we live so far from areas that the Expo is usually hosted that we're looking for venues to promote Katahdins and offer a sale in the West. This year we're taking a group of Katahdins to the Nugget sale in Reno, Nevada May 30-June 1 where they have Katahdin classes. Hopefully this will be a start and more breeders will be encouraged to attend, buy and sell.

Education plays a central role in my family so teaching people about raising and caring for sheep comes natural to me wherever I happen to be. I love

to talk sheep, I may be shy to begin with but let me get started talking and teaching about sheep, especially hands on, and I forget about everything else. We promoted Katahdins at the Oregon Agfest in April, a 2 day event attended by 23,000 people. It's an outreach to put agriculture in the hands of families. A good way to do this is taking ewes with baby lambs. I love to watch a child as they look into a sheep's eyes and make that first connection. I enjoy writing articles about sheep and pasture management, and have been privileged to have them published in the Katahdin Hairald.

I served on the KHSI committee that developed the KHSI page on Facebook. Social media is a useful tool to educate producers, new owners and promote the Katahdin breed. We put articles in the file sections but mostly people just want to ask questions and get quick answers which can be tiring to repeatedly answer, but by doing so

we make connections with people and promote Katahdins.

Some of my personal flock breeding goals are improving parasite resistance, retaining excellent mothering, milk and growth, good feet and leg conformation so hooves don't need to be trimmed and producing thick, muscled lambs that fit my market for mostly grass fed 120-140# lambs. which are pasture raised and rotationally grazed over almost 80 acres. Since 2011, we have been purchasing and consigning breeding rams at the Virginia Tech Forage-based Ram Test and incorporating these superior genetics into our flock.

Our farm operation focuses on selecting for maternal traits, growth, and parasite resistance with minimal inputs. Having use of an electronic ID system to aid in record keeping, has been incredibly beneficial. We are eager to continue to learn, grow and to advance our knowledge in years to come. 

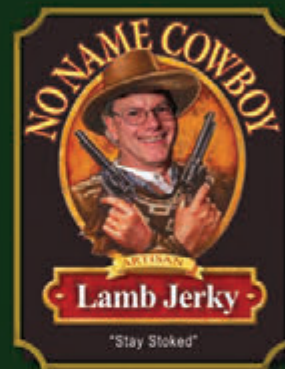

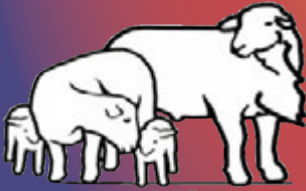

INGREDIENTS

1/2 cup mayonnaise	1 pound ground lamb
1 tablespoon maple syrup	1 medium onion, halved and sliced
1-1/2 teaspoons prepared mustard	2 tablespoons olive oil, divided
1/2 cup crumbled Gorgonzola cheese	2 teaspoons butter, divided
1/4 teaspoon salt	2 tablespoons balsamic vinegar
1/4 teaspoon pepper	8 Hawaiian sweet rolls, halved
	Fresh arugula, optional

DIRECTIONS

1. In a small bowl, combine the mayonnaise, maple syrup and mustard; set aside. In a large bowl, combine the cheese, salt and pepper. Crumble lamb over mixture and mix well. Shape into eight patties.
2. In a large skillet, saute onion in 1 tablespoon oil and 1 teaspoon butter until tender. Add vinegar; cook 1 minute longer. Remove from the pan and keep warm.
3. In the same skillet, cook patties in remaining oil and butter over medium heat for 3-4 minutes on each side or until a meat thermometer reads 160° and juices run clear.
4. Spread mayonnaise mixture over roll bottoms; top each with a burger and onion mixture and if desired, arugula. Replace roll tops.

Grilled Lamb Chops

INGREDIENTS

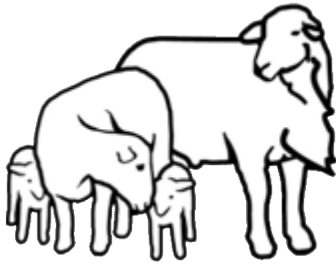
2 lb. lamb rib or loin chops
2 tsp. salt
1 tsp. ground black pepper
1/2 c. chopped fresh parsley
1 Tbsp. chopped fresh oregano
1/2 c. plus 2 tbsp. olive oil
2 garlic cloves, grated
2 tsp. lemon zest
1 Tbsp. fresh lemon juice
2 tsp. honey
1/4 tsp. red chile flakes
1 c. chopped mixed olives

DIRECTIONS

1. Add lamb chops to a resealable plastic bag. Season with salt and pepper; set aside.
2. In a medium bowl, stir together parsley, oregano, 1/2 cup olive oil, garlic, lemon zest, salt, pepper, honey, and chile flakes. Reserve 2 tablespoons of the marinade in a small bowl. Pour the remaining marinade over the lamb. Seal the bag, and gently massage the marinade into the lamb chops. Refrigerate at least one hour or overnight. Add the olives to the remaining unused marinade; stir in the remaining 2 tablespoons olive oil; cover and refrigerate until ready to serve.
3. Remove the lamb and olive mixture from the refrigerator 30 minutes before grilling. Meanwhile, pre-heat the grill to medium-high heat, 400° to 450°. Oil the grill grates well. Remove the lamb chops from the marinade and scrape off any excess marinade. Discard the remaining marinade.
4. Grill the lamb chops uncovered until grill marks appear, 3 to 4 minutes for rib chops, or 4 to 5 minutes for loin chops. Turn the chops, and grill until an instant-read thermometer inserted in the meat registers 135°, 3 to 4 minutes for rib chops, or 4 to 5 minutes for loin chops. Cover cooked lamb chops with foil, and let rest 5 minutes.
5. Stir the olive mixture to recombine the ingredients; spoon over the lamb just before serving.

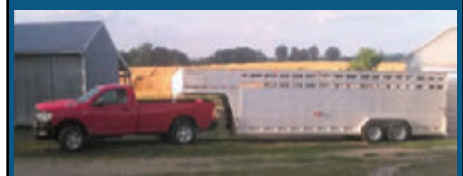
